# Step 6: Continue to Grow a Strong County Assembly

# **Schedule Assembly Meetings**

- Goal: Hold regular meetings (at least monthly) to keep the County Assembly active.
- Actions:
- Decide how often to hold meetings.
- Encourage members to bring at least one new member to each meeting.
  This will grow your Assembly to 40-50 members in a few months. New
  members must register on the state's website & fill out member forms,
  which the Scribe will keep.
- Everyone in the Assembly signs membership documents including an oath to the Assembly (do not sign with ALL capitals). Member forms are kept by the Scribe only. Never file member forms anywhere else.
- Scribe will submit to the Secretary of State, a monthly progress report on the status of the county toward filling positions and settling the county.

### Communications:

 If real ambitious, think about a County Assembly website and email (e.g., Proton Mail for security). Consider a post office or UPS box for official mail.

### **Hold Elections**

- Goal: After 90 days or when military signals, hold elections for County officers and representatives.
- Actions
- Hold elections for the Moderator, Scribe, Bailiff, and other positions.
- Recruit an interim County Clerk and an interim County Justice.
- Elect two temporary representatives for the State House (Pro Tem) until formal elections are held. The delegates may vote for Indiana to join the federal republic of the United States or ratify a state constitution.
- Elections can be done online, via email, in the forum, or at a private meeting.
- Announce the elected delegates on the website forum for confirmation and notify the secretary of state.

## Federal Representatives:

- Elect 2 delegates to represent the County in the Indiana House of Representatives to ensure proper representation at the federal level.
- The state Indiana House of Representatives will then elect and send the representatives to the U.S. House of Representatives who will then ensure that the Federal House of Representatives adopts the new Republic Constitution.
